

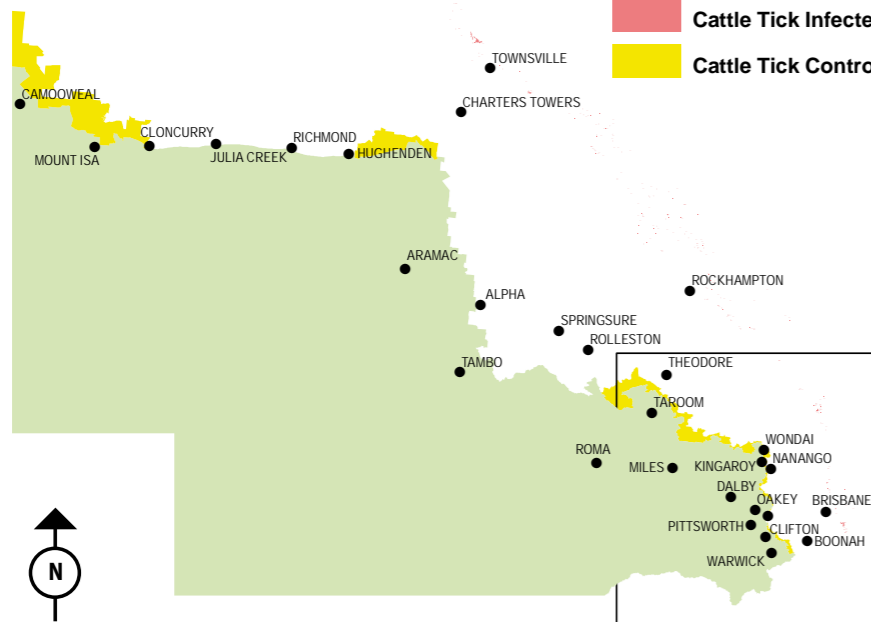
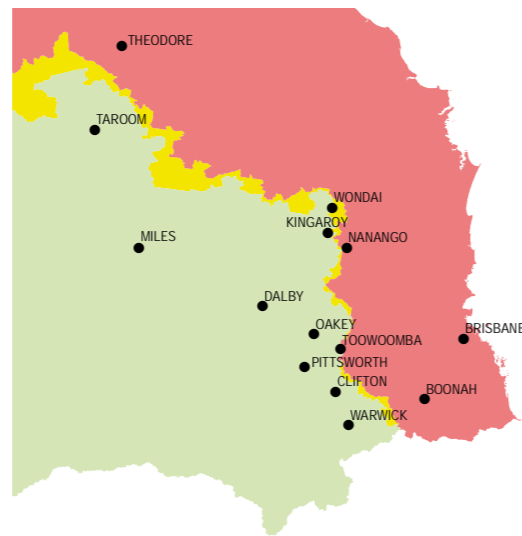
Move Easy

Your guide to moving livestock in Queensland

The tables opposite provide information on the documents that **MAY** be needed to move stock in Queensland. The numbers in the tables refer to the following documents:

1. Queensland **Travel Permit** (issued by a biosecurity inspector). Travel Permits list specific conditions that must be complied with
2. Queensland Livestock Movement System—Move Easy **Waybill** or **NVD** (National Vendor Declaration Waybill)
3. Cattle Tick Preliminary Treatment **Owner Declaration**
4. Cattle Tick **Certificate of Inspection or Treatment** (issued by a biosecurity inspector or approved person)

Stock moving from any property in the Queensland Control Zone are subject to movement conditions and require a Travel Permit. Contact your nearest DPI&F biosecurity inspector or the DPI&F Business Information Centre on 13 25 23 for details.
